"Afternoon Shadows," won third place at the Conneaut Community Center for the Arts Fireworks Juried Art Exhibition and was chosen for the High Desert Fine Art Festival poster.



Michael's work is owned by collectors across the country. It is part of the permanent collection of Merrion Oil and Gas, San Juan College as well as the City of Bloomfield, NM.
